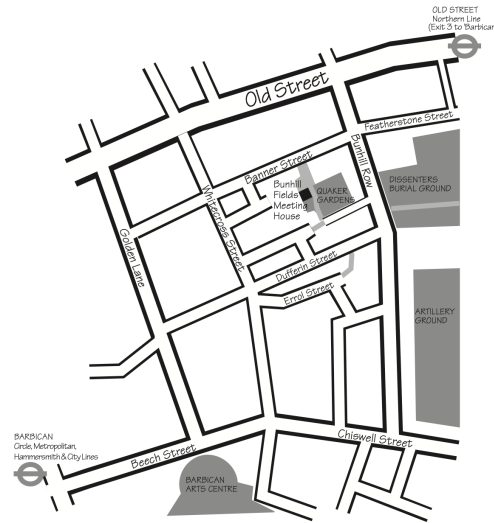

Hiring Rooms at Bunhill Fields Quaker Meeting House



This historical building has not been adapted for use by people with disabilities. There is access by car to near the front steps. The Meeting House is in the Congestion Charging Zone.

Parking in Banner Street and the surrounding streets is possible in the evening and at weekends. Buses are available in Old Street and City Road. Old Street Underground Station is about five hundred yards distant.

Our rooms are suitable for...

... simple worship (we welcome all faiths in our local community), committee or other smaller meetings, training, counselling and workshops.

Availability: Monday - Saturday 9:00 - 22:30, Sundays 13:00 - 22:30. Except third Wednesday of the month when Quakers meeting for worship 12:30 - 14:00.

Facilities



Both rooms have access to toilets on the semi-basement floor.

We regret that in this old building the only ground floor access is up several steps and the toilets are down a staircase. There are no lifts/slopes.

There is a garden, and sheltered balcony for refreshments.

There is Wi-Fi.

Meeting Room



This room comfortably seats twenty with direct access to the garden and adjoining refreshment facilities.

Library



This semi-basement room seats about twenty. Access to refreshment facilities is dependent upon the simultaneous use of the ground floor meeting room.
